MARCH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING RECAP

PRESENT: Blake Smith, Cythnia Bremer, Cheryl Morrisey, James Collins, Amy Velsor, Janet Linkert, Becky Hall, Jeannine Adair, Maggie Stewart, Katy Flom, Betsy Lindgren, Emily Graff, Pastor Loren, Pastor Derek

Vice President Blake Smith called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. The meeting began with a word of prayer.

STRATEGY SESSION: Pastor Derek gave an overview of the call committee that has been formed to find an Associate Pastor to start when Pastor Loren retires.. The first meeting of the call committee was held on March 6th and included the call committee members as well as Assistant to the Bishop Craig Peterson. Pastor Craig gave an overview of the call process. Part of the process will include a site visit by synod staff, we are hoping that they will come out in April on a Wednesday. There are three ways in which we can receive a call- we can suggest people for the call, the synod will give us names or a person can find us and ask to apply. The call committee will keep the council and congregation updated as the process moves forward. Blake Smith made a motion to accept Cythnia Bremer (as the chair), Jill Borg, Spencer Helms, Andrew Vechert, Betsy Lindgren, Janet Jans, Emily Graff and Pastor Derek Tronsgard as members of the call committee. James Collins seconded the motion, motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Blake Smith made a motion to approve the Secretary's reports from January and February, James Collins seconded. Motion carried and reports are approved as written.

SHORELINE REPORT: Pastor Derek spoke with Teri, the Shoreline Director- they are in need of staff! If you know of anyone you would like to work in Early Childhood and looking for employment, please send them in Teri's direction.

FINANCIAL REPORT: James Collins reported that similar to last month, the income coming in is less than planned but our expenses are also less than budgeted. This is typical for this time of the year. We are looking at building the budget plan based on seasonality as opposed to just cutting the budget and dividing by twelve to give a more accurate representation. All things considered, we had a favorable February. We will be doing the Dedicated Accounts summary on a quarterly basis as opposed to monthly. Our plowing bill is significantly higher than past years. Blake Smith made a motion to approve the financial report and Janet Linkert seconded the motion. Motion approved.

WORSHIP AND MUSIC – Janet Linkert, Janet Jans: Our Lenten sermon series has begun - the Bible Doesn't Say That, Ash Wednesday was delayed a week due to a snowstorm. Lenten Wednesdays have begun with our speaker interviews. This year the Linkert family, Skip Lindgren, and Logan Johnson are our speakers. Preparing for Holy Week & Easter in early April.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Megan Cegla, Maggie Stewart: Lighter month for children's activities other than a President's Day lock-in. Next year, we will look at ways to increase parent involvement for this event and ask for RSVPs in advance. On April 16th we have another family event planned after the Kids Choir sings in worship. VBS Planning is set to begin. Looking for helpers w/ decorations & prep. before July. The committee will be meeting soon to finalize details

YOUTH MINISTRY – Becky Hall, Betsy Lindgren: The Call Committee for the new Associate Pastor of Youth Ministry met for the first time on Monday, March 6th with Pastor Craig Pederson from the synod office. Next steps are to complete our congregational paperwork and schedule a meeting for a synod visit. Rib Fest was a successful event. Huge thanks to everyone who helped and/or donated. New trip format this year - Bible Camp for Elementary students, Christikon in Montana for Middle School / Confirmation, Houseboat for High School. New Moonlight Madness event in April for current 6-9th graders

EVANGELISM – Tera White: New Member families will be welcomed in the next several weeks. Pastor Derek is meeting with them for congregational orientations. Prayers and condolences to Kelli & Emma Mack at the passing of our Evangelism co-chair Chad Mack

FELLOWSHIP - Susan Hoversten, Jeannine Adair: Bingo Event went incredibly well. Close to 100 people attended. We raised \$1,291 for the Westonka Food Shelf. The Committee is working on a Fellowship Event at Back Channel Brewing. More information to come.

SERVICE MINISTRY – Katy Flom: Currently in the Food Share drive for the Westonka Food Shelf. So far we have raised \$1,291 through Bingo Night, \$767 through the Souper Bowl Offering, and \$1,850 through other gifts bringing our total raised to \$3,908 so far. The moms small group made 300 sandwiches through the Sandwich Project and delivered them to the Waite House in the Phillips neighborhood of Minneapolis. We are looking to get another date for all ages on the calendar to volunteer once again at Second Harvest Heartland in May

WOMEN'S MINISTRY – Cheryl Morrissey: \$750 from the Women's Ministry committee will be going to the Food Shelf

MUTUAL MINISTRY - Jo Mueller: No report.

PROPERTY-We are still looking for someone to head this committee. The Thursday volunteer group continues its volunteer work replacing belts and filters in the blower system, repairs in the bathrooms, and other projects around the church. We continue to be grateful for their hard work.

STEWARDSHIP - Amy Velsor: No report.

Cheryl Morrissey made a motion to accept the committee reports, Blake Smith seconded. Motion carried.

STAFF REPORTS: Pastor Loren reported that both he and Pastor Derek were at the hospital with the Mack Family. Pastor Loren went with the Mack family for a private prayer service. Our whole congregation is grieving the loss of Chad Mack. Pastor Derek reported that he's done the trifecta- a few weeks ago he had a baptism for a new family in our congregation. He did a service at Fort Snelling for Joan Wolfe and Chad Mack's funeral will be on March 17th. Pastor Derek will be doing a wedding in the sanctuary (this will be the first he's done in our sanctuary) for Lauren Elskamp on March 18th.

OTHER INFORMATION/ACTION ITEMS: Next month we will be tackling our Outdoor Sign project! We received a gift from a congregation family to purchase this sign. Cynthia Bremer has reached out to the city of Orono for permits and requirements. We will be getting three bids and the hope is that we will have the new sign up and in place by Rally Sunday. This spring, we will be working on the storage building. Pastor Loren and the Thursday work crew are looking into these plans. We are also hoping to look into updating the thermostats. We will look into energy credits. Maggie Stewart suggested that this summer, we as a council meet and map out the calendar or events for the year ahead- potentially discuss this at the July council meeting. Amy Velsor asked if we would be doing a mission trip this summer. We decided that we will not be this year. We reconfigured our youth events for the summer. Pastor Loren asked the congregation to donate \$1000 to the Foodshelf, we have done this in past years. Katy Flom made a motion that the congregation will donate \$1000 and Maggie Stewart seconded the motion. Motion carried. Pastor Derek discussed the interesting service on Sunday, March 12th. Centerpoint Energy advised that we evacuate the building until it could be determined if the smell was a gas leak or something else. Centerpoint determined that it was not gas, instead we believe that it was sewer gas. Rib Fest continued on as planned. Thank you to our congregation for being flexible.

We ended the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.

Blake Smith made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Katy Flom seconded. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned.

PASTOR'S CORNER - CALL COMMITTEE UPDATE

It's been a busy month here at Good Shepherd, and one of the most exciting developments has been the formation of our call committee.

At the start of the year, Pastor Loren informed the congregation that he intends to fully retire in August 2023 after 30 years of faithful ministry here at Good Shepherd. With that, our church council began the task of forming a committee to call a new full-time associate pastor in the fall.

During the March meeting our Church Council approved a call committee with Congregational President Cynthia Bremer serving as chair. Jill Borg, Spencer Helms, Betsy Lindgren, Andrew Vechart, Paula Umbehocker, Janet Jans, Emily Graff, and myself were also approved to serve on the call committee.

We then met with Pastor Craig Pederson from the Minneapolis Synod who worked with us to create a ministry site profile. This profile is a detailed resume of our congregation for potential candidates to help them get a feel of our community and congregation.

On **Wednesday**, **April 26th** Pastor Craig will be joining us during our Wednesday night worship to visit Good Shepherd and talk through the process with our congregation. With that, we hope you'll join us that evening in worship at **6:30pm**!

After that visit we will begin the process of receiving names of candidates from the synod to interview this spring/summer. In addition, we are also welcome to submit names of candidates to interview, so if anyone out there has a lead on an ELCA pastor who may be a good fit, please let us know!

Keep our congregation in your prayers as we discern through this process and find our next Associate Pastor. And, as always, please let me know if you have any questions. Stay tuned for more updates! **Pastor Derek**

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our budgeted expenses at Good Shepherd for 2023 are \$521,651. Good Shepherd's budgeted expenses through the end of February was \$43,470.96.45 with actual expenses of \$41,953.45. Actual expenses at the end of February were 96.51% of our budgeted expenses.

Our budgeted income for 2023 is also \$521,651. Budgeted income for January was \$43,470.96. Actual income for January was \$33,011.02 (75.94% of budgeted income).

During the course of the church year our income typically starts slower than our expenses in January and February. As warmer weather and spring-like conditions blossom around us, we simply want to thank you for your generous giving to Good Shepherd.

We also thank you for staying current in your giving which allows us to pay our bills.
