PASTOR'S CORNER

Holy Week may be one of my favorite things we do as a church. I am always struck by the privilege we have as a congregation to walk together through the final week of Jesus' life. With that, we hope you'll join us this Holy Week for the four special services throughout the week.

Palm Sunday, on March 24th, marks the beginning of our journey. On this day, we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, with crowds waving palm branches and shouting "Hosanna!" It is a wonderful celebration of Christ our king, but at the end of the service it takes a turn because we know where the rest of the week is headed.

Maundy Thursday on March 28th takes us to the upper room where Jesus shared his last supper with his disciples. On that night we will first share a simple soup supper together at 5:45pm before gathering for a reflective Taize service in the Sanctuary at 6:30pm. Like Jesus did with his disciples that evening, we, too, will eat bread and drink wine and remember Christ's body & blood given for us.

Good Friday on March 29th is a day of somber reflection as we reflect on the suffering and crucifixion of Jesus. On Good Friday we will gather for an interactive drama serviced entitled "Cry of the Whole Congregation." This service will lead us to the cross and to the tomb, and we will leave in silence awaiting what is to come on Sunday morning.

Finally, we'll get to Easter Sunday on March 31st! There will be brass, bells, a flower garden, uplifting music, an Easter breakfast, and more! It's a time to gather and celebrate the resurrection which is the foundation of our faith and our hope as people of God.

Holy Week is truly a special time, and we invite you and your family to join with us as we reflect on Jesus' ministry, remember his death, and celebrate the Resurrection which is God's gift for all of us! - Pastor Derek

Thursday, February 22, 2024

Present: Cynthia Bremer, James Collins, Maggie Stewart, Katie Vechart, Tera White, Katy Flom, Becky Hall, Jo Mueller, Amy Velsor, Emily Graff, Pastor Sarah Johanson, Pastor Derek Tronsgard.

President Cynthia Bremer called the meeting to order at 7:09pm. Pastor Sarah led the group in prayer to begin the meeting.

STRATEGY SESSION: Katie Vechart has agreed to fill the open Christian Education position on the church council. Katie and her husband Andrew live outside of Mound with their four young children. Amy Velsor made a motion to approve Katie to this position on the church council, Maggie Stewart seconded. Motion approved. Pastor Derek welcomed Katie to the council and thanked her for stepping into this role. Pastor Derek gave a digital sign update- the design has been completed and approved. We are setting up a meeting with the Orono City Planner in March and the goal is for the variance to be on the agenda for the Planning Commission and City Council in April. Rib-Fest was also discussed. It was proposed that we move Rib-Fest to a Wednesday night, April 24th, as opposed to a Sunday in March as we've done in the past. The thought behind the change is that we are going to smoke and cook the ribs ourselves like we did for Loren's party, but in order to do this for a Sunday morning we would have to have people here all night. The other thought is that doing it on a Wednesday can serve as an end of year celebration of our Wednesday night worship. There would not be worship this night. If the weather is nice the event could be held in the parking lot, if not we can do it in the Fellowship Hall. Youth going on the summer trips would be asked to volunteer to serve, assist with making the food, set up and clean up. Council members unanimously were in favor of this change for Rib-Fest for 2024.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Tera White moved to approve the minutes as written. James Collins seconded, motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

WORSHIP AND MUSIC – Pastor Derek reported- Ash Wednesday Service was well attended. We will be having community speakers at our Wednesday Lenten services leaning into the theme of "Journeys". On Sundays, our ministry staff will be preaching on a sermon series entitled, "Wrestling with God".

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION – Maggie Stewart, Katie Vechart: Ally is beginning to plan our summer VBS- it will be held on July 28th-July 31st. This is for students preschool-4th grade.

YOUTH MINISTRY – Becky Hall: Our Lutsen ski trip was a huge success. We had 18 youth and 8 chaperones attend. Everyone is already looking forward to this trip again next year- it was a beautiful location and great company. Registration is open for the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans (8th-12th grade) and Camp Christikon (5th-7th grade) for this summer. We are encouraging youth to sign up soon!

EVANGELISM - Tera White: We had two families join Good Shepherd this month. Tera will reach out to regular visitors and ask if they are interested in joining. We are exploring bringing back Greeters for church services.

FELLOWSHIP - Pastor Derek reported that our annual bingo night will be February 24th. This is a fun night for all ages. All proceeds will go to the Westonka Food Shelf.

SERVICE MINISTRY – Katy Flom: Katy Flom reported that Good Shepherd is now involved in "The Neighborhood Food Project" with WeCAN. The new initiative would ask Good Shepherd and other churches and organizations to fill bags of pantry food and household items each month to help bring in consistent donations to WeCAN. It was discussed that we would ask different groups or individuals to take charge of the bags each month so various members of the congregation could feel some ownership of this project. Katy will also be reaching out to WeCAN to ask if someone would like to come speak as a Lenten Speaker.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY - no report.

MUTUAL MINISTRY - Jo Mueller: Our church staff had a vision/staff retreat at Pastor Derek's home in January. Staff is hoping to do this once or twice a year. We are hoping to do a Church Council Retreat- a date will be selected at the March council meeting.

PROPERTY-Pastor Derek reported for property. Spencer Arne has agreed to serve on the next Church Council to be elected at our Annual Meeting as our property chair. Our Thursday morning group continues to do wonderful work around our congregation. Plans are underway for steps leading up to our Peace Garden from the parking lot. Thanks to a generous donation several years ago we have \$30,000 earmarked for this project. We hope to begin this project this spring/summer. After we complete the Digital Sign project we will turn our attention to the completion of the brick repair in the Sanctuary. At this time we have \$41,000 designated for this project.

STEWARDSHIP - Amy Velsor: Goals of 2024 stewardship include ways to thank our regular and faithful givers throughout the year, strategies to encourage new and younger families to share their gifts with the congregation, and other financial development strategies to help us continue our ministries to our church and community.

Becky Hall made a motion to approve committee reports, Jo Mueller seconded. Motion carried.

STAFF REPORTS- Pastor Derek and Pastor Sarah reported that they had an incredible time with the youth and chaperones on the ski trip. They also reported that the staff retreat was valuable in providing a direction for the staff for 2024. We had a funeral for former member Karen Cook at Good Shepherd in February. We will also host a funeral for a local teen, Evan Schmidt, on February 25th. Pastor Loren will be presiding over that funeral. Pastor Derek and Pastor Sarah spent a few hours at the high school providing counseling services for students and staff after Evan's tragic death.

We ended the meeting at 8:24 pm with the Lord's Prayer. Our next Church Council meeting will be on March 21st.
